In Memoriam

DR. MARK HASTEN, זצ"ל

JEWISH PHILANTHROPIST, BUSINESSMAN AND TOURO CHAIRMAN

Dr. Mark Hasten, Touro's longtime chairman, was a visionary leader and ardent supporter of Touro who passed away last February at 92. An engineer as well as an entrepreneur in myriad businesses, including banking, real estate and health care, Dr. Hasten long focused his philanthropic interests on education and Jewish continuity. Chairman during Touro's most significant period of growth, he was a major contributor to the establishment of Touro's Lander College for Women- The Anna Ruth and Mark Hasten School, in Manhattan and supported all the other schools as well.

For more than three decades, Dr. Hasten traveled from his home in Indianapolis to participate personally in the Commencement Ceremonies for Touro's Lander Colleges. He shared personal messages with the graduates, and generations of Touro alumni were inspired by Dr. Hasten's life experiences, his heroism, and his service to Klal Yisroel.

Fighting for Jewish Survival on all Fronts

Hasten was born in Bohorodczany, Poland, in 1927. He and his family survived WWII in Kazakhstan, where he entered the military. The young Hasten fought with the Polish Brigade of the Red Army against the Nazis on the Eastern Front during World War II and participated in the liberation of the Majdanek Concentration Camp in Poland. In a displaced persons camp, he joined the Irgun Tzvai Leumi and was aboard the Altalena, the famous ship, which was sunk by order of Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion. Hasten joined the Israel Defense Forces in 1948, and participated for two years in Israel's War of Independence.

From Southern Methodist University to General Mills and First National Bank

In 1952, Dr. Hasten married Anna Ruth Robinson and they emigrated to the United States in 1953. Hasten's education had been suspended at age 12 by WWII and he realized he needed training in order to advance professionally.

He enrolled at Southern Methodist University in Dallas and in 1959, earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering. He then spent nine years working for General Mills in Minneapolis, first in research, then as Chief Design Engineer for Corporate Engineering. While there, Hasten invented and designed the products and machines that produced the bendable straw, Cheerios, Pringles and Bugles. In 1967, Hasten was invited by his younger brother, Hart, to join his healthcare business in Indianapolis. Hasten insisted that the company be Sabbath-observant. As the business grew, they worked closely with banks to raise capital. Eventually, they decided they would rather finance their projects

themselves and they acquired a total of 36 banks under the First National Bank and Trust name. They divested their bank holdings in 2007.

The brothers worked together for 40 years and were partners in both business and community service.

With no Jewish day school in Indianapolis, they decided to create one. The Hasten Hebrew Academy began with 13 children and its roster now numbers over 150.



Visionary Leadership for Touro

Always passionate about education and especially interested in higher education that offered a Jewish environment, Hasten joined the board of Touro College in 1977 and became chairman in 1995. He and Touro founder, Dr. Bernard Lander, were extremely close, sharing a vision for building from the ground up.

"Dr. Hasten's business acumen and expertise helped realize Dr. Lander's educational vision," said Dr. Alan Kadish, Touro College President. "I don't believe Touro could have developed into what it did without Dr. Hasten's hands-on operational leadership and guidance as Chairman of the Board. He was a leader who supported the institution through thick and thin, who had vision, drive and tremendous ability," said Kadish. "He was a leader in business, government and education and always remained approachable, humble, warm and engaging."

"Dr. Hasten spoke to our students often of the four P's necessary for success – patience, persistence, positivity and perseverance and he exemplified all those traits," said Kadish.

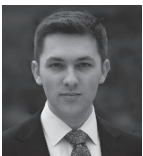

The Touro Universe Commencement 2020

This afternoon's ceremony marks the Forty-Sixth Annual Commencement of Touro College.

At today's ceremonies, the **Lander Colleges**, the **School for Lifelong Education** and **Machon L'Parnasa** are presenting candidates for 599 baccalaureate and 102 associate's degrees.

The Touro College Jacob D. Fuchsberg Law Center, on May 24, will present candidates for 128 juris doctor and 3 master's degrees.

Touro College of Pharmacy, on May 20, presented candidates for 75 doctor of pharmacy degrees.

The New York School of Career and Applied Studies in Brooklyn and Manhattan, on June 17, will present candidates for 649 baccalaureate and 259 associate's degrees.

Touro College Berlin, on June 17, will present candidates for 3 master's in business administration, 4 master's degrees and 19 bachelor's degrees.

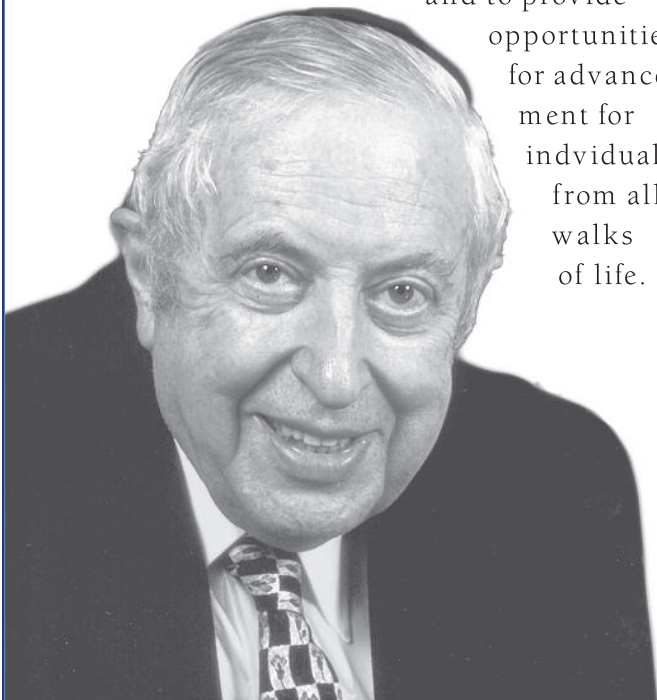
Dr. Bernard Lander, זצ"ל

Founding President of Touro College and Touro University

Rabbi Dr. Bernard Lander was an inspirational visionary leader who revolutionized the field of education. As an educator and preeminent scholar, Dr. Lander devoted his life to Jewish and general higher education. Dr. Lander founded Touro College in 1970 and served as its first president until his passing in February 2010. Under his stewardship, Touro underwent significant growth, becoming an institution with multiple campuses and international reach. Today, Touro educates approximately 19,000 students across the United States and around the world.

Dr. Lander's creative genius and original thinking continue to be reflected in Touro's innovative approach to the field of higher education. He believed that it was his mission in life to strengthen Jewish continuity through the myriad Torah and educational institutions that he established,

and to provide opportunities for advancement for individuals from all walks of life.



Before founding Touro College, Dr. Lander was recognized as one of the foremost influences on American Jewry. After receiving semicha (rabbinical ordination) from his beloved teacher, Rabbi Moshe Soloveitchik, he assumed the prestigious pulpit position at Beth Jacob Congregation in Baltimore, Maryland. Soon thereafter, in recognition of his communal leadership and work at Columbia University while earning his doctorate in sociology, he was named associate director of former New York City Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia's Committee on Unity, a precursor to the city's Commission on Human Rights.

In 1958, Dr. Lander was appointed dean of the Bernard Revel Graduate School of Yeshiva University, where he played a major role in the establishment of a network of graduate schools. He also served for more than thirty years as vice president of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations, where he emerged as a spokesman for the American Jewish community and was deeply involved in the creation of its acclaimed youth movement, the National Conference of Synagogue Youth. Simultaneously, he was a professor of sociology at The City University of New York and was selected to serve on several presidential commissions that dealt with social policy issues.

Touro College and Touro University are Dr. Bernard Lander's legacies, institutions that will continue to provide quality education to the Jewish and general community for many generations to come.
